# Word-play, poetry & paint

'I decided to make art out of the first book I found from the charity shop' – Tom Phillips

**Purpose:** Play with words and turn them into a unique artwork that might become poetry or even tell a story. Practise gathering your unique colour choices and sharpen your skills.

**Materials:** • An old, unwanted book. Old journal, paint - watercolours, acrylics, gouache, DIY tester pots, felt pens.


• A small paintbrush, jar of water, pencil, ruler (optional).

#### **Process**

- 1. Tear out one page and skim the text. Without over-thinking, circle any words that stand out for you (use a pencil for this).
- 2. Choose your favourite colours and without colouring over the words chosen, paint the rest of the page (or colour it in, if you like felt-pens) so that the words stand out.

### Things to consider...

Divide different parts of the page with a compass or a ruler to make shapes. Try doodling so there is a mixture of images and words.



### More things to consider...

- When you read back the words, does it sound like a poem?
- · Look at Tom Phillip's work called 'Humument'. He has created a series that spans decades using this technique and has inspired many artists over the years.
